LeRoy was born December 27, 1939 in Jamaica, NY, the only child born to Mrs. Anna Christian and Roy Alexander.

As a child LeRoy attended St. Mary's Catholic School where he became a star cross country runner, winning numerous awards and write ups in the local paper.

At 17 with his mother's blessing he entered military service in the Army where he served diligently acquiring many awards and certifications that culminated with his retirement from active duty in 1978 at the rank of Sergeant First Class.

Early in his military career LeRoy Alexander married a childhood friend, Lottie Lee Robinson. Together they had two daughters, Patricia Lynn who died one year after birth, and Karen Lynnette. After retirement LeRoy and Lottie settled in Neptune, NJ where he was hired by XEROX corporation as a copier technician in their New Jersey office. The marriage dissolved after 20 years.

In 1993 LeRoy Alexander re-married to Ms. Judith Holmes and her two sons Malcolm and Brent Holmes lived with him in Neptune, NJ. They were married for a total of 17 years until her untimely death in 2005.

During his time at XEROX he garnered many awards and accolades and enjoyed the respect and friendship of his supervisors and working colleagues. He retired from XEROX in 2006 with over 20 years of service.

LeRoy is survived by his daughter, Karen Alexander; Stepsons, Malcolm and Brent Holmes; Godson, Bruce Pugh; and many other family, friends and admirers.

Mr. LeRoy Alexander will be laid to rest in Arlington National Cemetery.
