

<u>Obituary</u>



disability. She worked with AIDS patients in the 80s and 90s, also with transplant patients, on the medical and surgical floors and in the Emergency Room. She was fierce in advocating for her patients' rights, quite willing to battle the doctors, nurses and administrators to make sure her patients received the treatment and benefits they needed and deserved. She was also proud that her work as a hospital social worker helped her to be able to take excellent care of our mother and father in their old age, which was one of the most difficult tasks she had to bear in her life.

She also loved music, particularly early classical music, the hymns of the church, and also Gilbert and Sullivan. In her 20s, she volunteered with the New York Gilbert and Sullivan Society as Stage Manager Assistant and Props Assistant. She also taught herself to sing late in life, and loved singing with the St. Mary's Choir and with the Raging Grannies.

And of course she loved the church. Her life at St. Mary's was really, really important to her, providing spiritual support, community, and purpose. Participating in services and on committees brought her great joy. She is surely missing you all wherever she is, as much as I know you miss her. She had her share of challenges but her suffering is at an end now. Rest in peace Rachel, we love you.
