Obituary

Marlon married the love of his life, Debra Quinn on January 17, 2001. Together they have four amazing children Malcolm born in 1996, daughter Ateesha born in 2001, son Matthew born in 2003 and Naomi born in 2007.

The Quinn family displayed a public and private unity and intimacy that was admirable to many, Marlon was the star player in making some of the simplest moments, fun and memorable. They journeyed through life as a family that played, praised and prayed together.

The quality of Marlon’s fatherly influence was seen in the goals, dreams and aspirations he set not only for himself but for his family. He enjoyed taking his children to school, and being present and available to help them whenever they needed him.

He enjoyed cooking and doing errands with his life-partner and wife, Debra, but it was their spontaneous, playful, prayerful, loving interactions as a family that will be the hallmark of their love.

Marlon was very passionate about vintage music, especially those old gospel songs. True to his Guyanese roots, he loved to watch cricket and versatile in assimilating to the American culture, he also loved to watch basketball.

Bro. Quinn, as fondly known to his church and community, was passionate about helping others through evangelism, as a deacon and leader of the prayer and intercession ministries. But, most importantly, he embodied an unwavering faith and a deeply rooted love relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.
