Carmen Williams Francois was born on January 26, 1942, in St. Andrews, Grenada. She was the daughter of the late Paul Thomas and Catherine Helen Williams. As a teenager, Carmen, her mother and six siblings migrated to Trinidad and Tobago. In order to further her education, Carmen enrolled in Holy Name Convent in Port of Spain, Trinidad where she studied to become a nun. At the age of 17, Carmen was drawn by an intense desire to help, serve, and care for others. She moved to England where there was a desperate need for nurses, there she pursued a nursing career at the Huddersfield School of Nursing.

At the age of 19, Carmen married the love of her life, Kenrick Francois. They enjoyed traveling the world together, but after being in England for 10 years they decided to explore career options in the United States. In 1968, Carmen followed her heart, and moved to the U.S.. she began working at Queens Hospital Center as a staff RN in their Emergency Room. With a thirst for knowledge and a drive to succeed, Carmen joined the Army Reserves in order to further her education. She obtained her B.S. in Nursing from Long Island University and an M.S. in Health Service Administration from Central Michigan University.

Carmen worked tirelessly for over 30 years as a dedicated professional dispensing caring comfort and compassion to all that came her way. She always chose kindness, believing in loving others the way her precious Lord and Savior asked us to love—unconditionally and without reservation. Carmen's heart didn't just open to her friends, neighbors, and patients, she yielded her heart to her family. Giving and helping family members in any way that she could. Whether through sponsorship to get their papers, starting a new life, or giving them a safe haven, a place to stay until they landed on their feet. Her home was always open to all. Carmen was the family's cheering squad all by herself. She believed dreams were meant to be reached for and if she could give you a loving shove, she gladly would.


