They named him "Slick" because he always came out unscathed when he went on dangerous missions. In the US Army, he was promoted to Spec -5. He was honorably discharged in 1969. Later on, he married his first love, Hattie Robinson.

Thomas entered the Thomas A. Edison Trade School and earned a certification in "Safety Education in Professional Driving". Shortly after his schooling, he entered the largest construction trade local union in the USA, called Local Union # 3 IBEW. Thomas became an excellent electrician. He was a proud union electrician especially when he helped light up the New York City skyline from the early '70s to '00s. During his career as an electrician, he received several awards and certificates for his intense work ethics of perfection. He retired with a full pension for all his efforts. Thomas could never stand still. He was always working even after his retirement from the industry. He enjoyed helping his friends and family with all types of construction work. He also loved to work on his cars and trucks as he was mechanically inclined that he knew he could fix anything.
