Obituary

Pansilyn attended the Brea's Head Elementary school in Clarendon. Soon after the family relocated to Annotto Bay, St. Mary. As a child, Pansilyn developed a health condition which affected her ability to continue her educational studies. While at home, she became a caregiver to many members of the family and found great pride in doing so.

During her time in Kingston she lived with a number of her family members which included her grandaunt Jane, other aunts, cousins, nieces and nephews. She made a name for herself and her business by selling biscuits, peanuts, and candies. Due to Pansilyn's charismatic personality and caring nature her business became extremely popular as she easily gained the respect of the teachers and love of students while selling items daily at the All-Age school in Denham Town.

Pansilyn met and married her husband Mr. Barrington E. Wilson and later migrated to the U.S. in order to be with him. While in the U.S. she showed her care and love for people by holding the position of home health aide; after many years in this position Pansilyn retired. After her retirement, Pansilyn was helpful in providing care to children in the family and never hesitated when asked for help in anyway.

Pansilyn was preceded in death by her parents, 4 brothers, Solomon, Herbert, John, Gifford; 2 sisters, Mida, Gladys. She leaves to mourn 3 sisters, Yvonne, Verna, Beverly; 2 brothers, Ranford and Neville, several nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives, loved ones and friends. She was loved by all she came into contact with, will be greatly missed.
