## <u>Obituary</u>

Willie Lee Howze was born on December 17, 1947 to the late Jessie and Herbert Howze in Rock Hill, South Carolina. Willie attended the public school system in Rock Hill until he moved to New York City with his mother Jessie and two brothers, John and Kenny. Willie attended the NYC public school system upon his arrival up north in the summer of 1959. Willie met his future wife, Barbara while enrolled at P.S. 191. Willie always kept a job since the age of 13. As a teenager he worked in a grocery store and delivered newspapers to save enough money to take Barbara on dates. He attended Commerce High School until the 10th grade.

In 1966, Willie was drafted to the Army and was deployed to Vietnam. While in active combat Willie accelerated in defending his company. On one occasion, Willie won the Bronze Star of Valor. While on a routine mission, 2 Viet Cong attacked Willie and his company with riffles and automatic weapons. Willie jumped into action and directed machine gun fire on the enemy. He began maneuvering out of the center of the ambush when the Viet Cong increased their attack, Willie found himself fighting them off in hand to hand combat. Once out of danger, Willie aided in the evacuation of his wounded peers and repairing the damaged communication system. He ran from vehicle to vehicle hand delivering messages to ensure everyone's safety.

In 1968, Willie returned home from Vietnam. He began working for the Post Office while dating Barbara. He left the Post Office to begin his lifelong career with the NYC Transit Authority. In 1973, Willie married Barbara and the two purchased their first home in St. Albans, NY. In 1977, Willie and Barbara had their first son, Rashaun. Willie continued his work with the Transit Authority and his role as a loving husband and father. In 1983, Willie and Barbara gave birth to their second son, Shane.

Willie enjoyed working double shifts and fishing on his days off. In 1995, Willie retired from the NYC Transit Authority. At that time, he returned to his hometown of Rock Hill, SC and resided there until 2017 when he suffered a stroke. Barbara and Shane brought Willie to NY to receive better care. On February 11, 2021, Willie succumbed to his illness at the James J. Peters VA Medical Center.

He is preceded in death by his mother, Jessie Howze and father, Herbert Howze. Left to mourn his death is: his wife Barbara; his two sons Rashaun and Shane; his granddaughter Jayla; three brothers John, Kenny and Michael; his sister Rhonda; along with a host of aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.







Don't grieve for me, for now I'm free, I'm following the path God laid for me. I took his hand when I heard his call, I turned my back and left it all.
