# **OBITUARY**

Shepard 'Ali' Alston II was born on March 14, 1978 in Paterson, NJ. He was the first son born to Lucy Alston and the late Shepard Alston Sr.

Shep graduated from Malcolm X Shabazz High School in 1996. During his tenure he enjoyed being an all-around athlete and participated in football, track & field, and basketball. However, football was Shep's main passion; as a starting player, he excelled as a defensive end, defensive tackle, and offensive tackle. He received several awards and accolades including Blue Chip Recruit, All City, All County, All State, and was ranked in Street & Smith's Yearbooks. In addition, Shepard was the first player from Shabazz to serve as team captain in the NJ North/South All-Star Football Classic.

After graduating high school, he continued his education and football journey. He attended Nassau Community College, where he was a two-year Letterman and 1997 All JUCO selection. Shep then moved on to the University of North Carolina, transferred to Temple University, and finished at East Stroudsburg University. He was named All PSAC and selected to play in the Cactus Bowl College Football All-Star game held in Kingsville, TX.

After graduating college, Shep signed with the Oakland Raiders where he completed the Rookie Training Camp and reported to Team Camp. Upon completion of his time in the NFL, he returned to Newark and coached football at Shabazz High School for five years, two of which he served as the Offensive Coordinator.

Shep married the love of his life, Regina, in August 2016. Together they have three wonderful daughters and a son. He prided himself on being a devoted husband, loving father, and entrepreneur.

Furthermore, he turned his passion for construction and development into what he affectionately named his crown jewel: 40 Acres Development and Investment Group. Shep also continued to grow his strong connection to the cities of Newark and Paterson by mentoring young men and sponsoring several youth initiatives. He was recognized for his Business Achievements by the JFK High School Athletic Department in November 2019; and received the Citizen of the Year Award from the Malcolm X Shabazz High School Football Team in December 2020. Finally, he was inducted into the Newark Athletic Hall of Fame in the performer category in Fall 2020.

Although his life ended too soon, Shep Ali's legacy will never be forgotten. He will be remembered for being dedicated, thoughtful, humble, and as a selfless man with a huge heart. His larger than life presence and outgoing personality will be sorely missed.

Shep was preceded in death by his father Shepard Alston Sr. He is survived by his loving wife Regina Alston, daughters Amia and Amya Alston, stepdaughter Allise Paredes, son Shepard 'AJ' Alston III; mother Lucy Alston; eight sisters: Crystal Walden, Sharon Belvin, Kimberley Alston-Witcher, Shannon Alston, Nicola Townes, La-Teia Menafield, Mia Alston and Tracy Alston; and a host of aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins, in-laws and friends.














#### I Really Miss You - 3 Winans Brothers
