Obituary

Bernard James was born in Harlem, New York on February 5, 1946 to his mother, Eleanor Harding and his father, William H. James. He was one of 5 children.

Bernard went on to serve in the United States Army as a field artillerist until 1968, and later graduated from City College of New York in 1976.

During his professional career, Bernard worked for various construction and engineering firms and served as an Architectural Draftsman, a Civil Engineering Surveyor, a Civil Engineering Bridge Inspector, and a Hydrographic Engineer.

Bernard began his Civil Service carrier with the City of New York, in 1988 at the NYC Department of Transportation (DOT). He later transferred to the NYC Department of Design and Construction (DDC) where he worked in the Infrastructure Division as an Assistant Civil Engineer. After that, he worked in DDC's Executive Office, as a professional and technical photographer, until his retirement in 2011. Bernard proudly worked for the City of New York for a total of 23 years.

In addition to his engineering career, Bernard was a brilliant photographer and received various accolades and recognition for his photography of city buildings, and landmarks, as well as for his photographic work for other New York Institutions like the Amsterdam News and the US Open.

In his personal life, Bernard was a proud father, an avid reader and a lover of knowledge, people, and his family. He remained a member of the Nation of Islam, Mosque No. 7, in Harlem since 1970 and was an incredible asset to his community. Ever dedicated to improving the lives of others and creating opportunities for youth; Bernard served as a mentor and volunteer math and science tutor, introducing many children to the Abacus, which he had mastered as a skilled mathematician. In addition to his community interests, Bernard was a lover of music, an aspiring pianist, and a life-long learner. He began taking piano lessons shortly before retiring and took great pleasure in his weekly lessons.

Bernard was diagnosed with Cancer in 2020 and fought a gallant fight until God called him home on March 5, 2021. He is survived by his daughter, Fareedah James, of Salt Lake City, Utah, and his three loving sisters, Sylvia Robertson, who was by his side to the end, Sharon Mack, and Andria Hawkins. He also leaves behind several nieces and nephews, and a host of friends and extended family members who he loved dearly.

Bernard was a people person, with great empathy and he was well respected. He was giving, he was caring, and he was honest. He always spoke his mind and kept his word. He was a shining example of the goodness in this world, and he will remain an inspiration to his family, his friends, and his colleagues.
