Peter Kow Abaidoo was born on November 10th, 1931 in Ebu, Ghana. In 1964 he traveled to the United States to further his education. In 1971 he graduated with a bachelor's in business administration degree with a major in management from Baruch College. The following year he obtained a Master of Business Administration degree with a major in management from Long Island University. His unquenchable thirst for knowledge drove him to pursue a second master's degree. So, in 1977 he graduated with a Master of Arts degree with a major in economics from Long Island University.

Peter began his professional career at Lever Brothers Limited in Ghana where he served as a short-hand typist before becoming a supervisor. Then he went on to work for the American Bible Society and the Jewish Guild for the Blind. Finally, he worked at New York Life Insurance Company in various positions such as a methods analyst, assistant methods analyst and compliance consultant. He worked at New York Life Insurance Company for 34 years before retiring in 2006.

In 1980 Peter became a member of Salem United Methodist Church where he served as a treasurer of the finance committee. As a member of Salem, he was the recipient of multiple awards such as the merit award and the father of the year award. He also served as a member of the board of directors for the GLIE community youth program. In his spare time, he loved to play and watch soccer, walk, and read the bible every day.

Peter loved God and used his word as a compass when navigating through his life. "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." (Luke 6:38). Peter's helpful nature was not just extended to friends and family but to anyone who he encountered. His door was always open to share his wisdom, funny stories, and his life experiences.
