Lauretta Eliza Shaw was born at her family home in Brompton, St Elizabeth at 2:30 pm on November 30, 1919. She was the 3rd child of 11 children born to Isabella Linton and James Parnell.

The family originally comprised of 13 children but unfortunately 2 of the siblings died in their infancy.

Being number 3 in this large family (7 brothers and 5 Sisters), meant Lauretta learned the art of cooking, washing, caring for her younger brothers and sisters very early on in life. She was also a dab hand at cultivating the land and attending to the farm animals. She was a true country girl.

Her parents were Christians and so she grew up reading the Bible, attending Church and Sunday school, learning all the principles of a Christian life that would give her a solid foundation for life. She was educated at the local school to elementary level.

Every single Parnell child had to learn a trade. Lauretta's chosen trade was Dressmaking, embroidery, and the delicate art of beading. When Lauretta was considered to be proficient in sewing, she was sent to Kingston to work alongside her older sister Roslyn in a store called Hanner's. Here she was able to excel in her chosen field.

Please note that making garments in those days did not come from a readymade pattern. You had to design, measure, and cut your pattern free hand a skill that stayed with her all her life. Lauretta could look at you and with a keen eye and imagination make for you your desired outfit.

On April 18th 1954, Lauretta married the love of her life Adrian Adolphus Shaw The marriage lasted 66 years and it was death that separated them on June 17th 2015.

In September 1983, Loretta immigrated to America. She first lived in Florida but later moved to New York. She later sent for her children who still reside here in the United States.

On the 6th of March, Loretta became unwell and was later placed on comfort care. She sadly slipped away from us on March 14th. She was 101 years old.

Her legacy is as follows; she is survived by her 4 children: Carl, Trevor, Yvonne, and Ann-Marie. Her last remaining sibling Hazel who resides in England. She also leaves behind many grandchildren, great grandchildren, nieces, nephews, relatives, and close friends who lives abroad, from Canada, Jamaica, England, and America.

She attended Wakefield Grace United Methodist church in the Bronx New York. She enjoyed reading her Bible every morning and standing on the Word and promises of God.

Her hobbies were gardening, cooking, baking, playing cards and doing puzzles. She enjoyed watching Maury and Jerry Springer.

We thank God for Lauretta and the contribution she has made to make our lives that much richer for knowing her and having her as a relative.

May her Soul rest in eternal peace Lauretta Eliza Shaw.

Sing the wondrous love of Jesus, Sing His mercy and His grace; In the mansions bright and blessed He'll prepare for us a place.


Refrain:
