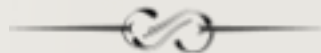

Obituary

Herman Joseph Wilkinson, affectionately known as “Hervin” and “Winty”, was the fifth of eleven children born to Isaac and Ethel Wilkinson, on April 19, 1936, at Mizpah, in the parish of Manchester, Jamaica West Indies.

Herman received his childhood education at the Mizpah All-age School. He attended Mizpah Moravian Church and became a member of the “Boys Brigade Christian Youth Group”. As a member of that group, Herman played the bugle and the drum. He later learned to play other musical instruments. Herman loved to dance and have a good time.

After leaving Mizpah School, Herman was trained as a carpenter. He climbed up the ladder as he gained technical skills and experience and he excelled in furniture making. Herman had strong work ethics and was a hard worker, but he knew how to relax and have fun. Herman was very easy going and soft spoken. In his early adult years, he was the life of the party at many family gatherings.

In 1962, Herman migrated to England where he joined some of his siblings who were there before him. After spending nineteen years in England, he relocated to the United States. In the United States, Herman continued to pursue his passion for carpentry and furniture making. He worked at Pisers Furniture Galleries in Manhattan, New York for several years. Unfortunately, Herman became ill while working and had to go on disability and subsequently retired. On March 13, 2021 God called him home to eternal rest.

To celebrate his life and honor his memory, Herman leaves behind: His children: Collie, Nicole and Iman. Sisters: Iris, Edith, Doris and Inez. Brothers: Ronald, Lloyd and Keith. Sisters- in-law: Totlie and Ritty. A host of nieces, nephews, grandnieces, grandnephews, cousins and friends, too numerous to mention by name.

His sister Evron, brothers Victor and Gerald, and his parents Isaac and Ethel preceded him in death.
