Claudius worked at Memorial Sloan Kettering Hospital as a Receiving Clerk for over 40 years until his retirement in January of 2017. When asked why he did not retire from work sooner, his answer always referenced that he needed to work to make sure his grandchildren were good.

Upon his retirement, Claudius became more tech savvy and was an avid user of WhatsApp. He used that platform to keep in touch with family overseas in Antigua and England as well as family and friends locally. Claudius' cell phone was never far from him and you could almost always guarantee a rather quick response.

Claudius and his wife Doris became members of Eastchester Presbyterian Church in the Bronx in October 1981. Claudius loved to make Christian tapes and CD's and would share them with his fellow church members. He was truly a man of faith!
