Obituary

Mr. Ronald Moore, the son of the late Hazel and Matthew Moore, was born on November 11, 1944 in the Bronx, New York. He resided in the Bronx until he entered his eternal rest on Monday, March 15th, 2021. Both parents preceded him in death.

Ronald was the youngest and last surviving of his four siblings. He spent his childhood in the Bronx where he attended Catholic elementary school but ultimately graduated from Aviation High School in 1963. Upon graduation, he started working at Bell Atlantic which later became AT&T. While working, he enrolled in several college courses at New York College to further master his craft. With AT&T, he began his travelling career – going all over the country and even to South America. He ultimately ended his career with Lucient Technology after working more than forty years.

Ronald was always curious and looking for new things. His curiosity and free time got him involved in roping and wrangling. However, he was still searching for something that meant “more” to him and that led him to becoming a brother in the F. & A. M. Masons and Order of Eastern Star organization. From there, his life changed. He went through all of the houses - all the way to the thirty-third degree. He held many positions in the organization but his main ones were Past Grand Master in the New York State, which he served as for eleven years, and Supreme Lecturer. Regardless of the title he held, he always offered guidance and advice to his brothers. He was a leader who sought to uplift his brothers in any capacity that he could.

At this point, he was a very well-rounded man. He found a career he loved and a brotherhood he loved even more. Aside from his growing brotherhood, Ronald also grew his family. He is survived by his wife, six children, the eldest, Robin Moore, and the youngest, Ronald Moore, Jr., six grand-children, and two great-grand-children. He is also leaving behind a host of loving friends and family. He will be sadly missed.
