Obituary

Ismay Matilda Braithwaite "Queen Mother" was the oldest of eight children born in New York City to Adelaide and William Braithwaite. Ismay attended the New York City Public School System and graduated from Julia Richmond High School. Ismay furthered her education at New York University where she completed Sociology and Psychology courses. In addition, she attended and graduated from the Manhattan Bible Institute.

With her family, Ismay attended the Harlem Pentecostal Church where she played the piano, sang in the church quartet, and taught Sunday School. Later, she joined and was confirmed at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, where she would become an active and faithful member. After teaching Church School for 5 years, Ismay was then appointed to serve as the Director of St. Andrew's Church School, a position she held from 1968 until her resignation in 1989. She was a member of the youth group, Entertainment Committee, and the Episcopal Church Women. She also led the Fundraising Committee, planned bus rides and Labor Day cruises, as well as college gospel choir and steel band concerts. Ismay initiated and organized annual celebration events during Black History Month, commemorating contributions made by Afro-Americans at the New York Veterans Administration Medical Center. Ismay retired from VA Medical Center after 42 years as the Secretary to Chief of Staff and as an Account Adjuster after 20 years at Macy's Department Store. Volunteer work was important to Ismay and she volunteered at Harlem Hospital, VA Medical Center, United Jewish Appeal, and St. Andrew's Church.

During a tribute service held at St. Andrew's Church on May 20, 2011, Ismay was assigned the title of "Queen Mother" and was the recipient of three awards: Director of Church School, Recognition for 21 years as Administrative Assistant and 10 years as a Volunteer, and Recognition for Outstanding Commitment to St. Andrew's Episcopal Church from the Episcopal Church Women. Ismay's two great interests were the youth and seniors, and her messages were: To the youth – our future church: Proverbs 22:6: "Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not turn from it." To the seniors - Be encouraged. God did not bring us this far to leave us. We are always in His care. Ismay's favorite Bible verses were John 3:16 and 17.



God gave Ismay the gift of motherhood as a "surrogate" mother to her nieces and nephews. She will be deeply missed. She leaves to cherish her memory: her beloved sisters, Ermine and Isalene; a host of loving nieces, nephews, cousins, Godchildren, extended family, her St. Andrew's family, and lifelong friends.
