## Obituary

Born on July 9th, 1934 in the town of Ramble in the Hanover parish in Jamaica, Roy S. Pinnock was called home on March 30th, 2021. He was the second child of Linford Pinnock and Louise Ellis Pinnock. From their union, Noreen Pinnock, Demi Pinnock and Stan "Wills" Pinnock were also born. His half-siblings included Lloyd Pinnock, Evelyn Pinnock and William Murray. Roy was a student of Ramble Primary and an active member of the Mount Ward Methodist Church. As the eldest boy, Roy assisted his parents with the daily demands of farm life from a young child. This helped hone his skills on the field as Roy grew into a very talented athlete. At Knockalva Technical School, he won several medals in track and field and high jump. Roy later became a cricket coach.

Roy enlisted in the Jamaican army at the tender age of 19. He served two years until he was old enough to join the police force. While in the force, Roy moved up the ranks to Corporal and was stationed at the Port Royal training school. He was responsible for training hundreds of new recruits. Roy was first married to Joyce Shearer. He later married Sheila Pinnock whom he remained with until the time of her death earlier this year. Roy left Jamaica in 1969 and moved to the United States. He first settled in Boston after later relocating to New York where he remained for the rest of his life. While in his new home country, Roy changed professions and became a machine operator at a packing facility. He worked there for over thirty years. Roy spent his golden years gardening, cooking and enjoying the company of family and friends.

Roy was the patriarch of a large family having had 10 children: Eileen Spence, Delores Pinnock, Basil Pinnock, Karl Pinnock (deceased), Beverly Pinnock, Leslie "Bunny" Pinnock, Hope Pinnock, Royan Pinnock, Jacqueline Pinnock-Ormsby and Karen Pinnock Bernard. Roy leaves behind 25 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren in addition to numerous nieces, nephews and godchildren.
