Mrs. Edith Mae Walker McIntyre

A new day dawned at the birth of Edith Mae Walker McIntyre, on March 21, 1936 and another day closed early Easter Monday morning, April 5, 2021 when she answered the Master’s call and entered into eternal rest. She was the second of seven children born to the late David Franklin Walker and Mary Ann McNeill Walker. She was preceded in death by her parents, five brothers-Louis Alphonso Walker, Dr. James Lynwood Walker, Marlyn Gene Walker, Harold Levane Walker, Harry Devane Walker Sr., and one sister, Juanita Grey Walker Kelly.

Educated in Cumberland County Schools in Fayetteville, North Carolina she was the valedictorian of the Class of 1953 from E. E. Smith High School. She attended Fayetteville State University where she became a member of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated. In 1957, she graduated and later obtained a Master of Arts Degree in Curriculum and Teaching from Cornell University and a Master’s Degree in Social Work from Rutgers University.

Edith grew up in the Pleasant Grove Church of Christ (Disciples of Christ), where at an early age she professed faith in Christ and was baptized. She also had a close association with Second Missionary Baptist Church in her hometown. During her early years, she was active in Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and the Senior Choir. Along with her mother and siblings, Edith moved her membership to First Baptist Church, Fayetteville, North Carolina.

In 1957, she married Randolph McIntyre, Sr. and to this union a son Randolph McIntyre, Jr. was born.

Edith taught in Harnett County for a brief period and later relocated to Newark and Roselle, New Jersey working as a teacher. She later became a Social Worker for the state of New York. Edith started as a caseworker and later became a Supervisor. She was very meticulous and highly respected in her field and dedicated 36 years to the profession.

Edith was a member of Second Baptist Church of Roselle, New Jersey where she participated in the music ministry as a member of the Mass Choir, played for the Sunday School and was instrumental in the start of a Hymn Choir. She was also a member of the local chapter of the NAACP, Church Women United, Red Hatters, and Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated. She relocated to Homewood, Illinois with her son Randolph McIntyre, Jr. and his wife after the passing of her husband Randolph McIntyre, Sr.

Throughout her pilgrim journey, Edith touched the lives of many. She exhibited an undying faith in God and a deep abiding love for her family and friends. Edith was a quintessential Woman of God. She lived life to the fullest as a true believer in God’s Word through the blessed hymns of Zion! Truly, it was God’s “Amazing Grace” that kept her through dangers seen and unseen, for she had the “Blessed Assurance” that Jesus is mine! Despite the trials and troubles of this world, she truly believed that “Just a Little Talk with Jesus” would make it right, all because “It Is Well” with her soul. Thank God for blessing us with such an incredible woman of strength, dignity, class, integrity, and unconditional sacrifice.

Edith’s legacy will be forever cherished by her son, Randolph McIntyre, Jr., daughter-in-love, Jennifer McIntyre, granddaughter Mikayla, and grandson Aaron, her aunt Roberta Walker of Fayetteville, North Carolina, sisters-in-law, Callie Jean Walker, Morristown, New Jersey, Arlene McIntyre Walker, South Hill, Virginia, and Bertha Lee Walker, Willingboro, New Jersey and her Godson, Bernard McIntyre.
