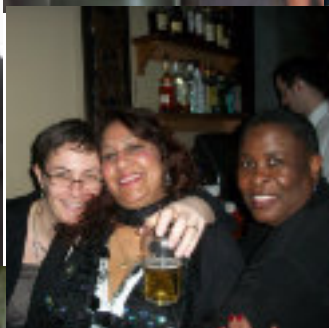
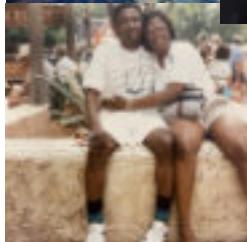

We love her and she will be dearly missed.

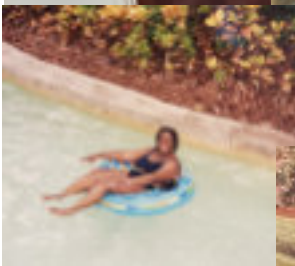












Fill not your hearts with pain and sorrow,
