Thelma Ophelia Parker Siverls was born in Greensville County, Virginia on August 28, 1936. She was the youngest of 11 children born to Lucy Cheeks and John Solomon. Thelma attended Greenville Country Training School. Upon graduating from high school, she joined her older sisters in Brooklyn, NY; as one of many millions of African-Americans who were a part of the Great Migration.

Thelma loved her family deeply and always strived to care for her family, both inside and outside of the home. She worked as a secretary for a few insurance agencies, and as an office manager for several not-for-profit agencies and churches, including Allen A.M.E. and Social Concern Community Development Corp.

Later in life, Thelma decided to attend York College during the late 1980's to pursue a bachelor degree in social work. A year later, she completed the advanced track program for a Masters Degree for Social Work at Adelphi College. She subsequently worked in the Family Center at the SQPA Roy Wilkins Family Center, supporting caregivers with teenagers who were involved with the court system or social services.

Thelma's hobbies included gardening, reading, cooking, camping in her trailer at Mountain Shadows, caring for her beloved pets, and attending church services when she was healthy enough to do so. She was a member of the Greater Allen A.M.E. Cathedral for over 30 years.

She is preceded in death by her husband James Arthur Siverls who passed on March 24, 2006. Their loving marriage endured for 36 years.

Thelma is survived by her four children: Thomas Solomon, George Parker, Steven Parker, Shawnette Nicole Siverls; her daughter-in-law, Enestine Solomon; granddaughters, Chrystal Dailey, Adrienne Solomon; great granddaughter, McKenzie Nelson; nephews, James Bunn and Hank Dennis; nieces, Diane Solomon, Willa- Jean Cambell, Brenda Harrison, Janice Harrison; foster daughters, La Crystal Rosa and Diane Rosa and multiple brothers-in-law and sisters-in law who have maintained the Siverls family connection; and other extended family and friends.
