Obituary

Hugh Elihue Flowers was born in Belize on August 28th, 1938. He was the fourth of eight children. His parents were Jane Brakemon and David Flowers. He attended Wesley Primary School. He was popularly known as “Hatcha”, a name that was also passed on to his youngest son, although no one seems to know where the name originated and why. Hugh and his sisters, Jessie and Elswith joined the Bowden household at an early age and Hugh became the brother that Nelson needed to deal with a houseful of girls.

Upon graduation, Hugh started working with his father learning the blacksmith trade. He later got the opportunity to work as an apprentice at the Belize Electricity Board and it was there that he became a trained and qualified electrician. A trade that served him throughout his life.

He met his lifelong partner, Yvonne Bent at an early age and they bonded in a union that lasted sixty-two years. Together they had five children. He migrated to the USA where he continued to work as an electrician.

Hugh was a true patriot of Belize, although he never returned to his homeland he kept very much in touch. He could always tell you the latest happenings in Belize. He loved to tease and loved to see the reaction he got when he talked about Cuba and Fidel Castro. The person that he really admired was Malcolm X and even though he was not a follower, he liked his teachings and bravery. He was a follower of his Godfather, the late Hon. George Price, who was the first Prime Minister of Belize and who is often referred to as the “Father of the Nation”.

Hugh died quietly on March 9th, 2021. He is predeceased by his sons, Dean and Sherman and grandson, Justice. He is survived by his spouse, Yvonne; sons, Gregory and Emory; daughter, Denise; grand children, Dean, Britton, Bishop, Shamika, Shermaine, Laquan, Lamar, Alex and Chelsea; great grandchildren, Christian, Milan, Nyla, Aaliyah and Elijah; and sisters, Jessie and Elswith.
