Virginia Browner McRae, daughter of the late Webster and Willie Tecora Browner, was born October 23, 1928 in Seneca, South Carolina. She mercifully departed this life May 11, 2021 at Calvary Hospital, Bronx, New York after extended illness.

At the age of six, Virginia moved with her family to Shelby, North Carolina. There, she attended her first through twelfth grades of education in the public schools of Cleveland County, North Carolina and displayed an unrelenting thirst for knowledge and sports. Virginia, affectionately called, "Gen" was looked upon by most as brilliant. She was an honor roll student and was also noted as an outstanding athlete who achieved many awards in the field of women's basketball. Whilst in High School, "Gen" was a Batons Majorette, a member of the Glee Club, the French Club, the Drama Club, and the track team. In 1940 "Gen" was voted "May Queen" and later became homecoming queen, "Miss Cleveland", which was put on the front page of "The Cleveland Echo" High School paper. In May 1947, she graduated Salutatory of her Senior Class and in September 1947, she entered the school of higher learning at Shaw University in Raleigh, North Carolina. Shortly after receiving her Bachelor of Arts degree in Elementary Education on May 28, 1951, Virginia returned to Shelby, North Carolina and received her Grammar Teachers Certification.

Between 1951-1953, Virginia taught a variety of subjects to fifth and sixth graders, including her nieces and nephews. Virginia, the Captain of Grammar and High School Girls Basketball Team for two years, participated in County Tournaments and received two trophies. On July 17, 1953, Virginia resigned as a teacher.

On May 24, 1952, Virginia Browner married Herbert Spencer McRae, Jr., whom she met in July 1948 in Washington D.C., where she spent her summers working. The two were married in the town of Gaffney in Cherokee County, South Carolina. From that union they had two children, a daughter, Audrey T. McRae and a son, Kevin H. McRae. After a few years of marriage, the McRae family moved to New York City.

As a firm believer in the Lord, Virginia was affiliated with Goodwill Baptism Church for over 60 years. She served in the Sanctuary Choir, Great Choir and Memorial Choir. She was crowned Queen from the "King & Queen" contest Sanctuary Choir on August 10, 1980. Virginia was a faithful and dedicated member of the church until she could no longer attend due to poor health. Although she was homebound, her love for the church never wavered & she continued to provide support and tithes.

Virginia was also a member of the Order of Eastern Star. Virginia has been a Dennis Lane resident/ stockholder for more than 45 years. She received a Distinguished Service Award by Dennis Lane for being on the Board of Directors from 1998 - 2018 (twenty years) as the Treasurer of the Board of Directors.

In September 1989, Virginia enrolled in weekend classes at the Westchester Business Institute, White Plains, NY. On May 16, 1991, at the age of 63, she graduated and received her diploma as a Word Processing Specialist with honors for maintaining a 4.0 Quality Grade Point Average. Her message for students of all ages, "After having been out of the school system for 37 years, IF I CAN EXCEL SCHOLASTICALLY, SO CAN YOU!"
