Bettye graduated from Edward Bell High School in Camp Hill, Alabama in 1953, and studied to become a Nurse's Aide. Bettye attended the Sardis Baptist Church, with her family. She loved going to church with her sisters and attending various family events together. In High School, Bettye was an enthusiastic track runner, and was known to participate in Walk-a-tons for most of her adult life. She loved to help others and walked virtually everywhere she went for as long as she was able, well into her seventies.

Bettye married Hosie Rowe in 1956, and the two became proud parents of Connie Rowe, who was born on August 6th, 1957, and who departed this life at the age of 55 on May 18, 2013.
