After many years of taking care of other children and homes she decided to stay home and take care of her own family. This encompassed more than just her immediate family. Known as "Mama" to her kids and grandkids, and "Aunt Rose" to her many nieces and nephews, Rosalie helped love, raise, comfort, discipline, advise and "set straight" many of us. She has been the rock of the family, holding the family down through everything all these years. Rosalie planned the annual family picnics, Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners, repasts and birthday celebrations which were almost ALL held at her home. Today some of us marvel at how we all were able to fit in that 3-bedroom apartment, but we did and she made sure everyone, related or not was welcomed and treated like family.

Rosalie was an active member of the East Ward Missionary Baptist Church in New York. She participated on the Mother's Board, the Gospel Chorus and the Kitchen Committee. She assisted wherever she was needed.

Last year family and friends were able to celebrate Mama's 100th birthday. The fact that so many people showed up on Zoom is a testament to how great a person she was.
