### **Obituary**

Astley Cummings made his entrance on September 19, 1934 to Ethline Moncrief and David Cummings in Labrynth, St. Mary, Jamaica. He spent the first four years of his life with his grandparents after which he moved to Galina with his father and stepmother. He received his formal education at the Galina Elementary School. He was an avid cricket fan and played for the Galina Cricket Club. Astley started his career at the Jamaica Public Works Department and later moved on to the Harbors Department as a lighthouse keeper in Galina. In 1962 he married Evelyn Johnson, a young teacher from Clarendon. The union produced seven children. In his later life he became increasingly involved with the agricultural society, leading him to the Banana Growers Association and the Coconut Industry. He was an outreach liaison promoting the planting of coconut trees throughout eastern Jamaica.

Astley was a faithful member of the Methodist Church in Galina and the brotherhood of The Masonic Lodge. He participated in many of the social events at the lodge and was a lively dancer. After consolidating his business ventures, he later migrated to the United States in 1988. He made Brooklyn his second home and worked in the security industry for a number of years. With failing health, he later relocated to the Bronx where he resided at the Workman Circle facilities and the Kings Harbor Nursing Home. He passed away at the Montefiore Hospital on May 14, 2012, leaving behind children Audrey, Elizabeth, Paula, David, Robert, Nigel, Noel and Michael; seventeen grandchildren; great grandchildren and a host of family and friends to mourn his passing.
