Obituary

Roxann Denise Robinson, age 59 was received by the Lord Jesus Christ to be at rest, at Saint Vincent's Hospital, Bridgeport Connecticut on Saturday, May 15, 2021.

Roxann was born on August 6, 1961, in Manhattan New York, to the late Ina Eumain Dalmida, and Gerald Sharpe. Roxann lived and grew up in the Bronx, New York. At the age of seven years old, Roxann had an encounter with the Lord Jesus Christ and remembered the great beams of light that shone into her bedroom where she had been sleeping. After looking at the light in amazement and great excitement, she remembers sensing a great peace like she had "just come down from heaven" and that God had done something special in her life. Since then, there was the prophetic calling upon her life and God would speak with her in visions and dreams. Through many trials and family hardships in her early childhood and young adult life, her faith waned, but her desire to know the one for which she was created burned deep within her heart.

While on her sick bed and in excruciating pain, Roxann called out to the Lord for help. She fell asleep only to be awakened by a great light and a voice that resounded loudly "There is a God!" A few days later the Lord appeared to her in a vision and healed her, releasing her from her pain and suffering. Then Jesus asked her, "What is troubling you? Tell me all about it!" Hearing those words, Roxann began to cry uncontrollably. She woke up with tears streaming down her face and from that day, she knew beyond a shadow of a doubt that Jesus was real and that He cared about her and what concerned her. At that time, she surrendered her life to the Lord and began to live solely for Him.

Roxann's excellence for academic learning allowed for her to skip two grades to attend Evander Child High School. It is there in the same homeroom class that she met her husband Basil Robinson, in September of 1975. In the 10th grade, in October of 1977, the two began dating and were married the following year of September 1978.

Roxann is a devoted, loving, faithful wife, mother, sister, and friend. She is simply defined as love itself. If you want to know love, you needed to know her.

She began her Secular career at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, July 1978. She started as a secretary and was promoted to the position of IT Support Manager (A- grade 17). Roxann was always professional in business. The qualities that stood out about her at the Federal Reserve were her dedication to work, kindness, compassion, and her attention to details. Her life and calling as a minister of the gospel of Jesus Christ, would begin a few years later. The Lord spoke to her and called her a Preaching Prophet. She is greatly loved. Roxann was always careful to speak only what the Lord said, often agonizing with whether she should share such revelation.

Together with her husband, they have traveled to five continents, and preached the gospel of Jesus Christ to countless thousands. They have started several works that are continuing today across the globe. Christ "The Way" Ministries International, was a truth birth from God. Roxann was devoted to this ministry. In March 2016, she began the "Woman of Kingdom Power Conferences"; a ministry designed to bring women to the knowledge of who they are in Christ and to help them fulfill their destiny in Christ.

She is an avid writer and poet, who started in her adolescent years. She has left behind many quotes, poems, thoughts, and notes. A deep thinker, she never wanted to displease the Lord. She made an endeavor to live a life that represented Christ well. Her sudden departure is and will be felt for many years to come, the only thing that can fill that void is the love of the Lord Jesus Christ.

While in the hospital for treatment, she led at least three souls to receive the Lord Jesus Christ and witnessed to countless others. Her greatest desire was to witness with Jesus and see the miraculous power of the Lord demonstrated upon the lives of people. Prime example, when faced with adversities, when retaliation would seem to be the thing to do, she waited on the Lord, and He said, "I have not given you the capacity to hate." This is her heart, this is Roxann. No need to attempt to fill or fulfill her ministry.

She has completed it successfully. Laid up for her now, as a soul winner, she is wearing a crown and a robe of righteousness.

Her pattern of life was always seeking the Lord, early in the morning and often throughout her day. Fasting and praying was also an intricate part of her lifestyle. She was a devoted student of the word of God and has left behind so many study guides, books and notes of the teachings of the Word of God. Her greatest attribute is that she is a worshiper of God. She would often sing and dance with the Lord; worship was her heartbeat. She would compile many playlists, often giving them out to all who would receive them. The scripture that describes her lifestyle, can be found in two places, the book of Matthew Ch. 4, and Luke Ch. 4, "Man Shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God ", this is Roxann. To put it simply, she just loves people!

2 Corinthians 5:8 (NIV): "We are confident, I say, and would prefer to be away from the body and at home with the Lord."


