Obituary

Edwin Charley Wynter known to many as “Penny” was the youngest of four boys born to Floris Weir and Alfred Wynter on May 13th, 1945, in Parry Town, St Ann, Jamaica.

Edwin worked in various departments at The Home Depot Store in Ozone Park, Queens for over twenty years, he was known and loved for his free-spirit by his co-workers and customers alike and in 2020, he regrettably made a decision to retire early due to health reasons.
