My Dearest Husband Wallace,

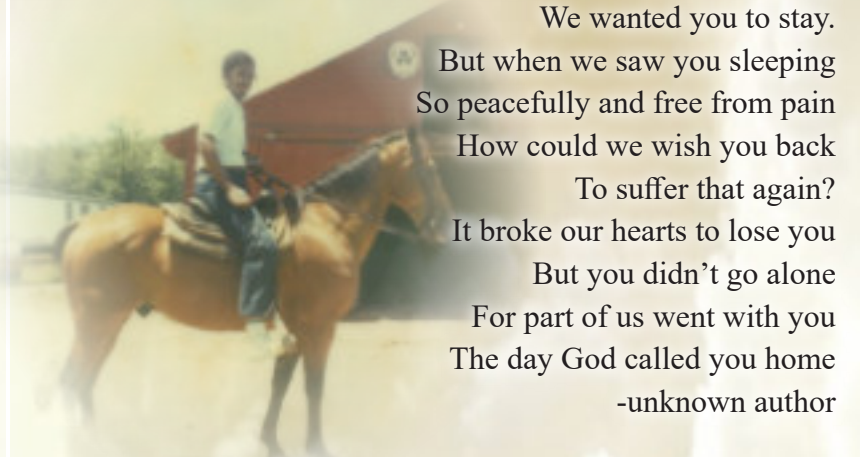

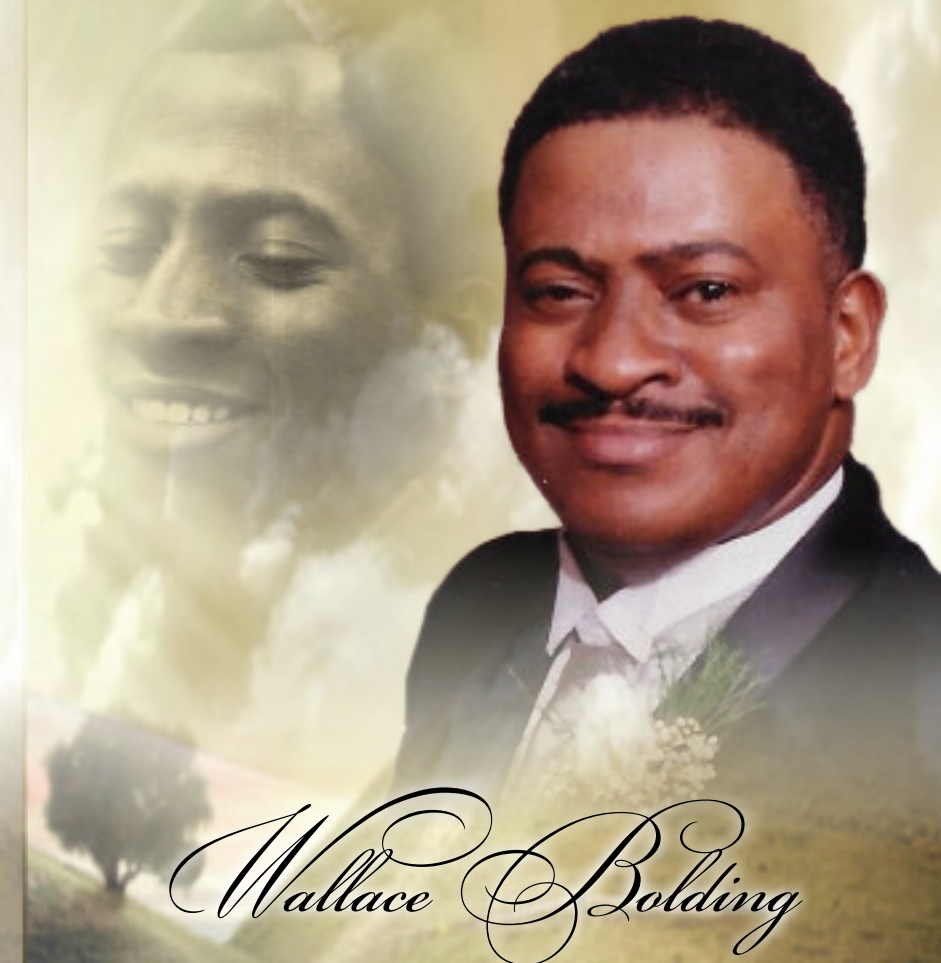

Obituary

On the 13th of August in 1953, Robert and Roszell Bolding welcomed their last child into the world, **Wallace**. Wallace was their 7th child. The Bolding family resided in New York City. Wallace was raised in a hardworking family.

Wallace was an amazingly talented, intelligent and artist teenager, and attended the High School of Art and Design in New York City. Later he attended Bronx Community College.

During these early years, Wallace met the love of his life Ann. Ann also from a large family, had a mutual attraction to Wallace. In 1974 they welcomed their daughter, Shaniqua.

In the early days of their young family, Wallace worked as a Yellow Taxi driver in NYC. A few years later Wallace started his Bus operating career with New York City Transit Authority. In 1990, Wallace and Ann celebrated the birth of their 2nd child Ahmod. After 20 years with NYC Transit Authority, Wallace retired. He then began working for Atlantic Express, a school bus company. He enjoyed transporting his students from various schools to and from home. Unfortunately September 11, 2001, NYC was targeted, and thousands were killed. The devastation caused displacement of many area residents including Wallace's students. Wallace was willing to go back to work to transport his students in the aftermath of 911, unknowingly putting himself at risk. A short time later, Wallace began working for Consolidated, another school bus company until his official retirement in 2015.

In 2004, Wallace was blessed with the role of grandfather for the first time to twins Jalen and Kayla; a role he was

perfect for!

Wallace enjoyed many hobbies. He enjoyed painting, horseback riding, swimming, fishing with his family and friends, and traveling with his family. Wallace was loving, funny, hard-working and caring. He was the life of the party!

In September of 2020 Wallace, was diagnosed with stage 4 metastatic lung cancer. Wallace fought his battle with cancer until the bitter end. Wallace was called Home to the Lord June 15th 2021.

Wallace precedes in death his parents Robert and Rosezell, his brothers Robert Jr. (Bobby) and Sidney, and his sister Mrs. Pearl Rhodes.

Wallace leaves to cherish his memory: his devoted wife Ann, his daughter Shaniqua Stram, son-in-law Jason Stram, his son Ahmod, his grandchildren Jalen and Kayla, his sister Mrs. Beverly Nash and her husband James Nash, his sisters Gloria Texidor, Cynthia Bolding, his many nieces, nephews, grand-nieces, grand-nephews, cousins, friends, co-workers, and neighbors.
