Born November 5, 1936, **Maxie** was one of four children born to Zipporah and Leonard Munroe. He was the second of the four siblings and leaves behind two sisters and a brother. Maxie had profound love for his parents and regarded the rest of his family highly. His mother, Zipporah, affectionately called "Auntie T" was a stay-at-home mom who made sure that her children were well taken-care of while his father, Leonard or "Mas' Len" acted as the bread-winner for the family with his profession as a butcher.

Maxie grew up in the Presbyterian church where he was also a part of the choir until early adulthood. Maxie was a popular, personable and charming individual who got along with everyone and was well-liked in his community.

Maxie was part of the Windrush Generation because like many other Jamaicans seeking better opportunities, he migrated to England in the early 1960's in anticipation of a better life. He would spend 21 years there before returning home to Jamaica to care for his ailing mother who had become blind by that time. Maxie cared for both his parents until they both departed from this earth.

In 1984, Maxie again decided to travel but this time it was to the United States. A few of his very good friends from England had emigrated there so he felt a sense of belonging. He would initially spend six months in the US before returning to Jamaica for a little under two years. He would return to the United States in 1986 and would remain there until his passing.

Maxie followed in his father's footsteps and when he came to the United States, he obtained a job at Cammock's Superette where he was the butcher. As he had from childhood, Maxie was able to make an indelible impression on those with whom he interacted and became well-known in his corner of the Bronx. He would hold court and charm those who visited Cammock's Superette until the business was sold.

Shortly after retiring from Cammock's, Maxie's health started failing him first exhibited by the loss of full function in his legs where he began to have difficulty walking. His illness progressed from there and while Maxie fought this challenge with every fiber of his being, he unfortunately did not overcome it. He was never short of medical attention and fought the good fight but his condition never improved but instead got progressively worse until he departed this earth on June 14th 2021.

Maxie is survived by his six children – Nalda, Michelle, Tameisha, Lamar, Xavier and Matthew and his four grandchildren – Keisha, Tia, Cruz and Onia.
