Obituary

Earline Pollock was the third of seven children and second daughter born to Edna and James Pulliam on Friday, July 28, 1944 in New York City. Her name means “noblewoman.”

Earline lived in New York all of her life. She was raised in the Bronx where she attended Theodore Roosevelt High School. After marrying Ernest Pollock on March 4, 1967, they moved to the Harlem Polo Grounds where they lived and raised their three children for over 50 years. Earline had earned her GED in her later years and subsequently worked 20 years for the Board of Education as a School Aide/Paraprofessional.

Earline loved playing cards, drawing classic cartoon characters, listening to music (The Whispers were her favorite R&B group), watching westerns, and cooking. She enjoyed spending precious time with her family. She was a woman of great devotion and compassion for others and was loved and revered by all. She always gave out of the kindness of her heart by any means and without thought for herself.

At the age of 76 years old, Earline passed into eternity on June 29, 2021, one month before her 77th birthday. She is survived by: her husband of 54 years, Ernest Sr.; children, Debra, Ernest Jr. a/k/a “Booby” and Darryl; grandchildren, Mark, Curtis, Kristin, Kercheval, Keanna, Kevon, Kelsey, Kendall and Kole; daughter and granddaughters-in-law, Amy, Ebony and Tara; siblings, James Pulliam, Dorothy Ivey, Judy Mallios and Marie McKoy; and a host of great grandchildren, nieces and nephews. 
