He was very involved in various activities, including chorus, musicals, football, baseball and basketball. After graduating high school in 1982, Drew attended Northeastern University (Boston) majoring in Sports Medicine/Physical Education. While at Northeastern, Drew became a member of the Apple Brotherhood, they all still stay connected with each other to this day. It was through this brotherhood that Drew became friends with Deborah "Debbie" Willett. They eventually started dating, got engaged and married May 24th 1998.
