<u>Obituary</u>

Egland Eustace Younge was born on November 1, 1954, at Triumph Village, East Coast Demerara, Guyana to Jonas Nathaniel Younge and Louisa Younge (maiden name Esau). He was the youngest of his siblings.

Egland attended Elaine Ward Christie Nursey School and Saint Mary's the Virgin Anglican School at Beterverwagting Village until sixth standard. In 1972, he began working at Transport and Harbor Department in Georgetown and did so for about two years. Then in 1974, he joined the Guyana Police Force where he was stationed in various villages, including Den Amstel, Linden, and LaGrange.

Egland migrated to the Unites States in 1995 with two of his children—Eglon and Marsha. He worked at American Warehouse, Pier 5 in Brooklyn, New York, where he worked from 1995 to about 2003. Unfortunately, he became disabled at this job due to an accident. After healing from that accident, he worked temporary jobs until gaining employment as a Home Health Aide in Brooklyn, New York.

In 2019, Egland underwent surgery on his brain to remove tumors that were found. He was recovering until his health began to decline in 2021. He was hospitalized at Kings County Hospital on Monday, April 12, 2021 before being transferred to hospice services at the Brooklyn Center for Rehabilitation and Healthcare at the end of April. He passed away on Tuesday, June 22, 2021.

Preceding Egland in death was one of his sisters, Alma E. Younge (deceased in 2012).

He is survived by: his siblings, Margaret Tappin, Clement Younge, Claudette Younge, and Claude Younge; children, Julian Younge (in Trinidad), Eglon Younge (in Guyana), Marsha Younge, Beverly Younge (in Barbados), Kelton Skinner, Delroy Skinner (in Guyana), Rondell Younge (in Guyana), and Tatiana Green; daughters-in-law, Alicia Younge and Melissa Skinner; grandchildren, Ki'mani Akili Phill, Skyla Younge, Mosiah Younge, Kelton Skinner, Jr., and Qubert Skinner; and a large extended family of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends too numerous to mention.
