After a lengthy illness, Alice entered into eternal rest on Wednesday, July 14, 2021, at the Overlook Medical Center in Summit, New Jersey.

Alice remained in this position until her health precluded her from continuing. Alice retired on February 28, 2021.

Those who knew Alice will remember that not only did she talk the talk, more importantly, she walked the walk.

She often worked late nights helping to put many of the programs together. However, she was quickly recognized for her special talent for decorating. She often spent hours decorating the church as well as the dining hall for special occasions. Alice was known to carry her own "toolbox" when decorating. In addition to her interior design/decorating talents, Alice was well known for her culinary skills. She assisted in the kitchen and was well known for her cheesecake, apple crisp and coconut ice box cakes. Alice was truly grateful for the talents that God blessed her with and was not hesitant to share those blessings with all.
