# Obituary

**Delores Barbara Napier**, affectionately known as Aunt Dolly, went home to be with the Lord on Sunday, June 27, 2021 at age 88. Her last moments were spent at home with children, grandchildren, other family members and friends.

Delores was born at the family home in Kingston, Jamaica on October 31, 1932. Daughter to Ellena Constantia Napier and Eugene Harold Napier, she was the youngest of six children, and the last survivor of her siblings. Delores attended St. Anne's All Age School in Kingston, Jamaica. After finishing her secondary education, she worked with Garment Manufacturers as a seamstress and was eventually promoted to supervisor.

Delores was an active member of Mizpah Church of God in Kingston, Jamaica. Her love for the Lord was evident in her life. Working, taking care of her family and going to church were her priorities. She was frequently caught singing her favorite hymns while working and cooking, one of which is, "How Great Thou Art." The sudden and unexpected loss of her one and only love, Clifford, in 1967, left her to be the sole provider for her four children. In May 1978, she decided to forge a new path by relocating to the United States. Delores worked as a housekeeper and in a short time she was able to successfully bring her children to live with her in the U.S. She soon thereafter began working in the healthcare industry where she found her true passion caring for others as a Home Health Aide. Aunt Dolly had a heart of gold and this was seen in the way she cared for each of her clients. Her love and dedication to those under her care was unmatched. In sickness, she showed up for work. In snow storms, she showed up for work – even when her children implored her to stay home. "If I don't go who's going to take care of my patients!" was often her retort.

Aunt Dolly, matriarch of the family, loving mom, grandmother, great-grandmother, and friend, opened her home to all. She loved to cook and to bake. Her favorite moments were family gatherings on Sundays. She always cooked enough "just in case" someone stopped by, and that was usually the case. She remembered your birthday and was famous for her birthday cakes, decorated with the sprinkles on top. She would remind you that there is a birthday cake waiting to be picked up. The love she made you feel was guaranteed to change your disposition for the better. She would remind you that things were going to be okay, always the encourager. She was a woman of faith. She was the saint in our family, the peacemaker, your conscience at times. She will live in our hearts forever.

In 2016, Delores became ill after suffering a stroke. The caregiver now became the one that needed to be cared for, and that would not be an easy task. She was not used to being in that position. She did not like when others "fussed" over her. Eventually, she would settle into her new situation and was back to being her jovial self, exhibiting her comical nature and entertaining the family and even her caregivers. In the last year of life, she lost the use of her legs and soon her body would be racked with other issues. Amidst all of the pain and anguish, she never complained or become bitter or angry. The Lord in His mercy would take her home to rest soon thereafter. Now she is resting in His arms.
