**Gerald Gaylord, Sr.** was born on February 3, 1949 in Manhattan, New York to his late parents, Clarence and Irene Gaylord. Gerald Gaylord graduated from New York City Public School, and attended Seminary and received his Associates Degree in Criminal Justice. He resided in Queens, New York for over 40 years.

Gerald spent his childhood in Manhattan, New York where he learned gymnastics, karate and swimming in spite of having polio. Spanish Harlem is where is began his love of martial arts and dedicated his life to the Ketsugen Karate Federation Black Belt Union where he was promoted up the ranks to becoming a 10th Degree Chief Grand Master Teacher under the late Erskine R. Matthews. He was drafted by the United States Army in 1969 during the Vietnam War, and served as a Military Police Officer at Fort Benning, GA where he received an Honorable Discharge in 1971. He returned home where he joined the New York City Department of Corrections, at Rikers Island and retired in 1995. He was a member of The Masonic Prince Hall Joppa Lodge #55. He was a respected member of the community.

He is survived by: his three sisters, Ida Gaylord-Thompson, Doris Gaylord-Wilson (Norman Wilson), and Anna Gaylord-McCain (Wade McCain); his twelve children, Gerald Gaylord, Jr., Robert L.
