Our Dad's Life Story

Malcolm Nathaniel Bennett, a visionary entrepreneur, and real estate pioneer, transitioned from labor to reward on July 21, 2021, surrounded by members of his beloved family. Malcolm was born to the late Ardella and Joseph Arthur Bennett Sr, on June 29, 1947, in Selma, Alabama. While Malcolm and his brother Joseph Jr. were young children, the Bennett family joined The Great Migration and relocated to Los Angeles, California. He received his early education in the Los Angeles school system, graduating from Susan Miller Dorsey High School in 1965. He later enrolled in Los Angeles City College and California State University, Los Angeles, where he studied Business Management. In 1972, Malcolm married Carolyn Marie Whigham, from this union two children, Steveland Lemar and Kara Lynn were born.

Malcolm's affinity for entrepreneurship began early in his career. He owned and operated the International Glass Company. In 1976, Malcolm and Carolyn formed Bennett & Bennett Associates, a Property Management Company. Less than a decade later, Malcolm expanded the company's offerings and changed its name to International Realty & Investments and served as its Owner & CEO. Malcolm was also a Realtor®, licensed broker, and licensed contractor, with more than 40 years of experience in management, sales and acquisition of income producing properties. He was regarded as a knowledgeable professional in his industry and testified before Congressional committees in Washington, D.C., as an expert witness.

Malcolm (affectionately known as Mr. B.) was not only dedicated to building his business, but he also wanted to contribute to the success of others in his field. He founded the Minority Apartment Owners Association (MAOA) in 1987 and served as its President. Malcolm also held the office of President for the Inglewood Rental Property Owners Association (IRPOA). In 1994, he was inducted into the Congressional Hall of Records for outstanding Community Service. He held positions as the President of the Los Angeles County Board of Realtors® and Regional Vice President for the National Apartment Association (NAA).

During the last economic downturn in 2007-2008, Malcolm served as the State Court Receiver for several local Banks as well as the City of Los Angeles. He served as a Receiver for the nationally known Dunbar Hotel, a state and national Historical-Designated Property. After being released as a Receiver, he continued to manage properties for the City of Los Angeles. In addition, Malcolm also served as a Receiver for other properties in Riverside County, Orange County, San Bernardino County and San Diego County.

Before his untimely passing Malcolm served as the Chair of the Property Management Forum for the National Association of Realtors (NAR), Chair of Property Management of the Investment Housing Committee for the California Association of Realtors (CAR), and the 2020 President of the Apartment Association of California Southern Cities (AACSC) in Long Beach. In addition, Malcolm was appointed twice to serve on the Los Angeles County Tax Appeals Board by two different Los Angeles County Supervisors. He served the board as both member and President and at the time of his passing was serving under Supervisor Holly Mitchell.

Malcolm's community involvement spanned beyond real estate. He served four-year terms on the Board of Directors for the Friends of the South-Central Los Angeles Regional Center for the Disabled (SCLARC) and two terms as President for the Crippled Children Society. Malcolm was also a devoted member of First African Methodist Episcopal Church of Los Angeles (F.A.M.E.), under the leadership of Reverend J. Edgar Boyd, Senior Pastor.

While Malcolm was dedicated to his work, he also loved to celebrate. He always welcomed the opportunity to commemorate an occasion or toast to someone's success with a glass of champagne. Malcolm loved his family. He enjoyed traveling to different cities to meet his daughter for what they called "mini" vacations. Their last trip was to Scottsdale, Arizona in June of this year, and they had plans to travel to New Orleans in August of 2022. Shortly before his passing he had the opportunity to meet his three beautiful granddaughters.

Malcolm was preceded in death by his beloved parents, Ardella and Joseph Arthur Bennett Sr., and his brother, Joseph Arthur Bennett Jr. He is survived by his two children, son, Steveland Lemar Whigham, daughter, Kara Lynn Whigham (Sonya), granddaughters, Sloane, Autumn, and Willow Whigham, nephew, Christopher Bennett and nieces Celeste M. Hall, and Angela Hall, former brother-in-law and dear friend Lemar C. Whigham (Evon) and a host of dear friends. His staff at International Realty & Investments in Los Angeles and Long Beach, California, the entire Real Estate and Rental Property Management Communities and numerous Associations where he served as a faithful member, his Church Family, the surrounding Communities, and a host of friends.
