Juanita Slade Boylan was granted her angel wings and entered eternal rest on Thursday, August 12, 2021. Nita, as she was affectionally called, was born June 20, 1927 in Paterson, New Jersey to the late Walter J. Slade and Emma Cumber Slade. She was educated in Paterson, NJ and graduated from Central High in 1945. Nita was a life-long learner and always wanted to better herself, completing numerous courses towards an accounting degree at Montclair State University.

She received accolades from The Federal Security Agency for her work on the Pittsburgh Bloodtesting Program through the Pittsburgh City Health Department in 1952. She prided herself on servicing for more than 30 years the families and students in South Orange Maplewood School District, where she retired.

Nita served as a champion for justice, advocating for those she felt were mistreated and underserved. She continued to serve as a defender for students and families diagnosed with special needs, securing placements and funding for special programming. While advocating for others, she also campaigned for her own rights, eventually winning her complaint against Popular Merchandising Company after an investigation was launched and her employment was reinstated.

Nita met Jesse Leonard Boylan, Jr. through friends at a social function and the two united in holy matrimony on February 21, 1958. From their union, the apples of her eyes were born, Jesse Leonard III and M. Ali Shabazz-El. Nita's most gallant work was for her beloved sons, whom she adored. She gave them the best of everything and spent many hours praying for their success, assisting them to be triumphant in their life's endeavors. She sacrificed her happiness to protect them from the perils of life.

While Nita spent the majority of her life in New Jersey where she undertook many positions and opportunities, at 90 years young she relocated to Clinton, Maryland, where she lived with her son Jesse and his family. Her health concerns with Dementia and breast cancer warranted additional care, which she received from her loving caregivers Natta and Marion at Springtime Homes. Through it all Nita continued to fight for her autonomy and quality of life until God called her home.

Nita was preceded in death by brothers, Allen, Walter, Whitfield, and Steven Slade; sisters, Dorothy Daniel, Olivia McGill, Elaine Slade-Booker, and Dorothy Slade; brothers-in-law, Bradley Daniel, Walter Smith, Leo McGill; sister-in-law Patricia Slade and niece Jacqueline Conley.
