Obituary

Yvonne (Blossom) Dorothy Hyman was born on December 5, 1934, to the late Aubrey and Ida Abrahams in Kingston, Jamaica, West Indies. She grew up with her younger sister Daphine and her older brother Louis, born on the same birth date as Yvonne 4 years earlier. Her brother gave her the nickname Blossom as a child. The name stuck and to many, especially family, that was how she was known. Yvonne went to secondary school at St Hugh's High School where she graduated with her Cambridge Standard. Subsequently, she attended Commercial College at Durham College. Along with her academic accomplishments she learned to play piano and enjoyed doing so, becoming quite adept at it. She always ensured having a piano in her house wherever she was. Yvonne also developed a love for cooking, gardening and sewing.



Yvonne met Roy Hyman through his close friendship with her brother Louis and after several years on November 7, 1959, they were married. Yvonne and Roy brought forth 3 children from their union, Neil, Leighton, and Janice who they raised through their early years in Kingston Jamaica. Yvonne continued her work career in Kingston while raising her children. Yvonne was a member of St. George's Anglican Church and then St Andrew's Parish Church in Jamaica.

Yvonne and her family migrated to the United States in 1978 as she and Roy wanted to provide a better way of life for their family. She began work in New York City at The Board of Global Ministries where she worked until the birth of her twin granddaughters from Leighton and his wife Hilda in 1999. She retired, and with Roy, lovingly helped to take care of the girls during the weekdays for a few years.

During her time in New York, Yvonne became a member of St. Luke's Episcopal Church and remained so for 38 years. Throughout her years she exhibited the commendable virtues of a Christian woman, such as kindness, empathy, integrity, generosity, and her abiding faith in God.

Through her later years Yvonne's health started to decline and on August 14, 2021, surrounded by her loving family, she went to meet her Lord.

Left to mourn her passing are her sons, Neil and Leighton; daughter, Janice; brother Louis; sister, Daphine; granddaughters, Christina and Nicole; sister-in-law, Hyacinth; daughters-in-law, Hilda and Josette; and many nephews, nieces, cousins and friends.
