Johnnie B. Jackson was born on November 1, 1935 to Sarah Evelyn Jackson and Allen Jackson in Macon, Georgia. Johnnie loved football and played for the Ballard Hudson Maroon Tigers. He graduated from Ballard Hudson High School Macon, Ga in 1953.

Shortly after graduation, Johnnie enlisted in the U S Navy. He was stationed and remained in San Diego, California until he completed tour of duty. Deacon Jackson loved Unity so much that he would give the shirt off his back just to help somebody. Deacon Jackson always would say If anybody asked you about me, just tell them that I'm

just a child of God.

Johnnie enjoyed family outings, cigars, NY Knicks, and football especially when he had the chance to watch his grandson play for Kennedy High School. On any given Sunday he would watch the NY Giants and surely let everyone know that the Giants are the best NY area Football team.
