## Obituary

**Meyers Ephraim**, 65 years of age, went on to glory on Monday, August 23, 2021 at 12:13P.M. at Bayhealth Hospital in Dover, Delaware. Meyers, affectionately known as Mike, was born on December 17, 1956, in Brooklyn, New York to Hattie Lee Ephraim. He was raised in the Bedford Stuyvesant section of Brooklyn with his two sisters, Grace, Rosalyn and younger brother, Ugochukwu.

Mike graduated from Boys High School and attended Brooklyn College where he enjoyed playing Basketball and Baseball. Mike worked several occupations before being sworn in with the New York City Housing Police Department in July, 1981. After the NYC Housing Police Department eventually merged with the NYC Police Department, Mike was promoted to Sergeant in May 1995 and to Lieutenant in April 2000. While working in the NYPD, Mike attended Saint Joseph College in Brooklyn, NY and earned a Bachelor of Science in Community Mental Health and Human Service/Counseling. Mike retired from the New York City Police Department on July 28, 2001 leaving him to pursue other careers and passions. After retirement, Mike became a Biblical Teacher, an Investigator, and an Entrepreneur.

Mike married the love of his life and soulmate Emily Ephraim on April 25, 1992. Mike was the father of a daughter Michele Ephraim and a son Kayin Ephraim, both of whom he loved dearly.

Mike was ordained as a Deacon at the Oak Grove Baptist Church in Harrisburg, North Carolina on December 5, 2010. He was also a Basketball Coach at the Oak Grove Baptist Church, and part of the mentoring program for at-risk boys in the Charlotte, North Carolina school district. Mike and Emily were called to expand their personal ministry by providing ministerial services to the homeless. He loved spreading the gospel through teaching the word of God. Every Thursday of the Week he taught basic bible study with family and friends via ZOOM during the pandemic of 2020 and into 2021. Meyers is Co-Founder of Genesis Family Center in Delaware.

Mike hobbies included fishing, boating, reading, swimming, and traveling. His true passion was spending time with his wife of 32 years, Emily as well as their many family and friends.

Mike was preceded in death by his mother, Hattie Lee Ephraim and his sister, Rosalyn Ephraim. He is survived by his wife Emily, son Kayin Isaiah Ephraim, daughter Michele Ephraim, sister Grace White, brother Ugochukwu O.
