Obituary

Ronald Ward Pazant was born September 5, 1942 in Harlem, New York City, to Roscoe and Hazel Pazant. He was the second of five children. Ronnie graduated from Aviation High School in Queens, New York. As a youngster he was active in clubs and organizations such as the Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts of America and the St. Pauls Community Church Choir. He sang acapella at his school talent show with his group The Sinclairs. Ronald was quite a musician, he played the saxophone and imitated some of the jazz legends of his time.

After graduating from Aviation High School with honors Ronnie enlisted in the United States Air Force during the Vietnam Era where he served several years in Okinawa, Japan and was trained as an Airplane Mechanic. Ronnie completed his tour and received an Honorable Discharge from the United States Air Force.

After his return home Ronnie decided to follow in the footsteps of his Father and became a New York City Police Officer, once again serving the community. Officer Pazant moved through the ranks in many different assignments most memorably as an "Undercover Cop" his outstanding work was noticed and earned him a promotion to Detective. Detective Ronald Pazant was assigned by the NYPD to the security detail of "Bodyguard" for Mayor Ed Koch and also the The Honorable Mayor David Dinkins. After 15 years of service Detective Ronald Pazant retired from the NYPD.

In 1984 Ronald Pazant was appointed by the Mayor of New York City to NYC Marshal, it is then Ronnie opened his business with its central office in Queens County New York. Ronnie married and began his family with Delores Clarke. He was a caring husband and supportive Dad to their two children, William and Randy. Ronnie never had idle time. When he did take time to enjoy the pleasures of life he chose to enjoy international travel, photography and fishing with his buddies. As a car enthusiast, Ronnie owned cars of all types, generally two at a time. Ronnie was also very good with his hands and acquired a skilled trade as a plumber, he was also very savvy with computers and electronics.

Ronald Pazant graduated from the NY Institute of Technology. He majored in Psychology and successfully earned a Bachelors Degree while still conducting his business as a NYC Marshal. After 36 years of service as a NYC Marshal with 15 years of prior service dedicated to the NYPD, Ronnie retired from work due to health related issues. On September 7, 2021 Ronald Pazant went home to be with our Lord and Savior.

Marshal Pazant is survived by his sisters Carol Ann Colas, Margaret C. Pazant and Hazel E. Rivers, his sons Randy Pazant and William Clarke, Ronnie's 2 beautiful grand children Kayla and Kaidyn, his many nieces and nephews in the United States and Australia, and a host of other relatives and friends.

We will all honor his spirit and mourn his loss. Ronald Pazant will truly be missed.

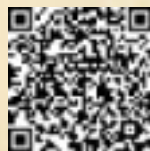
