Jennie Emily Quintana was born in New York City, on June 24, 1937, The first of 6 children of immigrants from Puerto Rico, Felicita Prieto and Silvano Quintana, a decorated World War 2 veteran. A student of an exclusive Catholic Education from first grade through high school, she would later attend and graduate secretarial school. Jennie was a dutiful daughter, a caring sister, a loving aunt and a devoted mother. Family was always at the center of her life.

She also cherished her two dogs, Zsa Zsa and Charo.

Her many interests included traveling, bowling (she was a league bowler for over two decades), tennis, reading, knitting, cooking, gardening, photography and card playing. She loved music and loved to dance. She also loved watching her soap opera's and novellas. She was the vice-president of the board of the co-op she lived in for over a decade.
