Billie Octavie Gourdine was born on January 28th, 1933 in New York to the late Octavie Walker Barnes and the late Wilson Walker. She attended Washington Irving High School. She was raised and spent much of her childhood summers in Wainscott, New York; where her parents took her and where she would later take her own family to share cherished memories through the years with her extended family members.

She established her legacy by passing on information about wealth and how to acquire it to her children and grandchildren as well. She was passionate about ensuring that they would know how to set themselves up for success.
