

Iola always was meek, humble, a mother's child who deeply loved her mother, her family and would do anything she could for them.

She attended Wright High School in Blenheim, SC and graduated with the Class of 1960. She then relocated to Brooklyn, New York for better opportunities. Iola was a woman of God who loved to attend church. As such, she connected with Mt. Sinai Baptist Church in Brooklyn under the leadership of Rev. Lyman Lowe at what time along with her sister Josephine. When there were afternoon services, Iola would always attend.

Iola loved her job and worked tirelessly up until her retirement after many years. Even after retirement, she would still leave home every day to go sight-seeing, shopping or visiting family and return around the conclusion of the work day. As her health failed, Iola moved in with her sister Irene and her family. Irene and Iola were inseparable. Also, in her spare time, Iola enjoyed collecting stuffed animals and attending events at the local Senior Citizen's Center. She was a woman of few words but her love was always felt and she enjoyed her trips to her hometown in South Carolina. Many years later as Irene began to experience issues with her health, Iola transitioned to Bushwick Center for Rehabilitation and Nursing with her nieces, Elinda Dobbs Williams as caretaker, as well as Annette Twine.

Preceding her in death from her immediate family are her parents. Her brothers: Willie B, George Jr., O'Daniel and Claude, who died as an infant. Nephew Henry James Bridges was viewed as a brother. Sisters: Annie Jane Matthews and Lillie Mae Bridges and Rosa Lean Dobbs.
