

Craig attended Chad School located in Newark, NJ and Essex Catholic High School where he graduated in 1983. Following graduation from high school, the preppy kid from Newark ventured to Alabama where he attended Alabama A&M University for I year and then transferred to Shaw University, in Raleigh, North Carolina, a place near and dear to his heart where he graduated in 1992 with a Bachelor's Degree in Communication.

As a result of his dedication to education, mentorship and young people, following his graduation from Shaw, he returned to his roots as a teacher working for both Chad School and Essex Catholic. He then returned to his passion, where he last worked as a teacher at Sprout University School of the Arts and as a counselor at the Boys and Girls Club of Mercer County. Up until the time of his death, he maintained close relationships with many of his current and former students.

Craig met his perfect match who became his wife of 14 years, Sheilonda (Sheila) Dunagan, in Trenton, NJ. You could often find Craig and Sheila, shopping, traveling, at football games and spending time with their children. Together they made a home full of fun and love. All who entered felt welcomed. Sheila loved him to the very end, as she never left his side as they battled through his cancer diagnoses together.

As an avid Giants fan and through his love for the game he became the biggest supporter of his youngest son's promising football career and found a home with several teams in Pennsylvania. He dedicated his time to the Morrisville Little Bulldogs, The Wardogs in Bristol, PA, and The Lower Bucks Flag Football Association (LBFFA).

Community was important to Craig, but he never forgot the strong spiritual connection he established through the teachings from his parents and grandparents. He attended the Salvation Army of Levittown as a commitment to his Christian Faith. Like his father, Craig was an avid reader, and you could always find him reading a newspaper. The family joke was often around the fact that he was the only person in PA receiving an LA Times newspaper among others. He was CNN.

The best parts of Craig can be found in his children. His infectious laugh and wide smile will be missed most of all, as he made life better for all of those with whom he came into contact. We will all miss his dancing, talking with his mouth full of food, practical jokes, laughing and just his company.

Craig was preceded in death by his father Rudolph Graves, paternal grand-father, Benjamin Graves, maternal grandparents James & Siffie Cooper, fathers-in-law Woodrow Champion & Charles Dunagan, mother-in law Gwendolyn Dunagan and his uncles Eugene Cooper, Benjamin Graves, Jr. and aunts Dorothy Knight and Louise McCray.




