**Frieda D. Smith**, a phenomenal woman, entered peacefully into eternal life with her lord and savior Jesus Christ on Tuesday, September 21, 2021. She lived for 94 years.

She is reunited in heaven with her beloved husband of 29 years, Charles L. Smith Jr., who died on April 19, 1979.

Frieda was born on June 24, 1927, in Cleveland, Ohio. She was the fourth of nine children born to Mary and Robert Stephens the son of a former slave owner in Stephens, GA.

Growing up in Cleveland with her brothers and sisters the Stephens household was hectic, chaotic, and always full of love and joy and a family capable of making the most of good and hard times.

Frieda attended The Ohio State University and Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland. It is at Case Western where she met and fell in love with Charles (affectionately) known as, Smitty), a dashing and handsome young man from New Jersey with a Cuban heritage and savoir-faire that Frieda found irresistible. Out of this union, Frieda and Smitty had three children, Stephanie Darleen, Charles Leslie (III) and Danita Carol. Frieda and Smitty raised their family in East Orange and Montclair New Jersey, and it was in Montclair where the Smith family blossomed and flourished.

Frieda loved living in Montclair and often said there was no other place she would rather live. After years of working for Liberty Mutual Insurance Company and The Royal Globe Insurance Company in East Orange, Frieda pursued her life-long goal of becoming a teacher. In 1969 she joined the National Teacher Corps, a program created by the Higher Education Act of 1965 to improve elementary and secondary education in low-income areas. Through the Teacher Corps, Frieda earned her bachelor's degree in Education from Montclair State College. In 1971 she was hired as an English teacher at East Orange High School where she taught until her retirement in 1988.

In the middle of it all, being a loving and attentive wife, a mother of three rambunctious children, a well- loved teacher by her students and peers, and a doting grandmother, Frieda was most happy working with Trinity Episcopal Church in Montclair where she served as a lay minister and member of the Vestry.

With a passion for scholarship and serving her community, Frieda was a charter member of the Omicron Xi Omega chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. in Montclair, NJ. As an active member she served on numerous committees, held leadership offices, and often led the chapter in prayer and meditation during gatherings and events.

Frieda is survived by her three children, Stephanie Lightfoot (Robert), Hartford, CT; Charles L. Smith III (Quinta) Roseland, NJ; and Danita Locks, Atlanta, GA; plus grandchildren Justin Smith, Atlanta, GA; Stephen Lightfoot (Kishauna), Manchester, CT; Brian Lightfoot (Nikki), Denver, CO; Leslie Locks (Trey Gillison), Atlanta, GA; Allison Locks, Atlanta, GA; and Dana Locks, Atlanta, GA; great grandchildren Kylee and Kandance Lightfoot; Court and Trey Gillison; her sister Helen Spears, Atlanta, GA; her brother Gerald Stephens, Cleveland, OH and a host of other relatives and many friends.
