

## Celebration of Life

Reverend Dr. Verna Lorraine Coburn was born July 17, 1949, to the late Robert and Pearl Monroe. Verna grew up in the Bronx, attended New York City Public schools and was the third of five children. Verna was a stay-at-home mother to Shawan Fox and Letta Brewington-Smith for the first 12 years of their lives. However, in 1983, Verna joined Health Insurance Plan of Greater New York, where she worked as a Medicare Reconciliation Clerk until retiring in June of 2006.

In November of 1990, Verna married her best friend and loving husband, Jimmy Coburn. Over the past 31 years, the two of them have supported and worked side by side with each other in their private and spiritual lives. Their covenant relationship indeed honored their love and reverence for God who created heaven and earth, and was an example for young and old married couples alike.

Verna was known as an exceptional cook, and she loved to feed any and every one she encountered. Family and friends often asked her to make her famous sweet potato muffins, cream cheese pound cakes, sweet potato pies, and red rice, just to name a few. Her love of cooking led her to write her first cookbook, Pearl and Verna Christian Cookbook in 2021. She intentionally included her mother's name in the title to honor her beloved role model and connoisseur of culinary arts. Moreover, all who knew Verna knew that she loved God, her family, and cooking; and those who spent any time with her were bound to hear about all three!

Reverend Dr. Verna Coburn was called to preach the Gospel in May 1980. She became a licensed minister at Solid Rock First Born Church of the Living God in May 1983. She received her theology degree in Biblical Studies from Tabernacle Bible Institute in May 1986 and Leadership Training School of Ministry in 1995. Through continued studies, Dr. Coburn received both her Master's Degree and subsequently earned the Doctorate Degree in Philosophical Theology in June 2013.

Dr. Coburn was passionate about teaching which began during her tenure at Tabernacle Bible Institute in New York under the leadership of the late Rev. Dr. Daisy Garvin but was later a faithful member of the Greater Revival Time House of Prayer. In 1996, Deacon and Rev. Coburn moved to Pennsylvania and were led by God to join the Reaching Out for Jesus Christen Center in Brodheadsville, PA., under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Kenneth L. Pearman, where she labored until she transitioned to be with the Lord. In September 2007, Dr. Coburn and her husband Jimmy established Rescue Mission Outreach Ministries under the stewardship of Rev. Dr. Kenneth L. Pearman. Dr. Coburn was a servant of God who was, without question, sold out for Jesus and a prayer warrior extraordinaire. She purposed to win souls for Christ and to preach the gospel in and out of season.

On September 25, 2021, surrounded by her husband and children, the Lord called Verna to be with him in Paradise, where there is no sickness or pain. In addition to her parents, Verna's sister (Linda Monroe), brother (Michael Ladson), sister-in-law (Grace Lawrence), and two nieces (Terri Lawrence, and TaNile Woodberry) preceded her in transitioning to Glory.
