Nelson Waller, son of the late Mary Waller was born October 13, 1962, in Brooklyn, New York. He attended both elementary and middle school in the Bronx and was a graduate of Theodore Roosevelt High School. Later he attended Lehman College to study Business Administration. He was truly passionate about his work at Elmhurst Hospital and loved his coworkers dearly. For over 35 years Nelson resided in Edenwald Housing, was an active member of the United Christian Baptist Church, and was ultimately baptized there.

In his younger years, Nelson expressed interest in business, entertainment, and doing every and anything that his older sister, Mary, wanted to do. She recalls him crying, when he was younger, that he wanted to spend time with "Wary". Nelson often told the stories about his summer visits to South Boston, Virginia. On one particular occasion, he recounted his time on the family farm. During this visit, he shared that he and his younger cousin were forced to run from a bull in fear. Even though the encounter was scary at the moment, reflecting on it always brought a smile to his face. Similar to his mother and sister, they had a fear of animals.

Nelson developed great relationships with his family. He was especially close to his cousins, Lafayette "Sonny" Harris and Edith Grimes. They were like his bonus siblings. When he would visit his sister he would call her and say that he was coming over and would request that she make them tacos to eat. Lovingly, she would tell him that she didn't know how to make tacos and instead they bonded over Taco Bell. Nelson would always make it his mission to be around for every birthday, holiday, and milestone in the lives of the people he loved.

Nelson quietly departed this life Thursday, September 30, 2021, at Albert Einstein Hospital in the Bronx, New York. He leaves behind his loving sister, Mary Elizabeth King, cousins, Lafayette "Sonny" Harris and Edith Grimes, nieces, Sharon King and Jacqueline King-Robinson, and a host of other devoted cousins, nieces, nephews, and friends.
