



Jeannette P. King was born in Saint Augustin Florida August 20, 1939, to the late Robert William Pasco and Eloise Williams Pasco. She departed this life on Wednesday October 6, 2021. She was preceded in death by her husband Dewey King and son Kenneth R. Newsome.

Growing up a descendant to native American parents Eloise Williams & Robert Williams Pasco who married in 1939 in a customary ceremony of the Cheyenne Indian tribe that migrated from the Mid-West states to the east coast around South Carolina area and settled the Northeast coast of Florida; the couple had one daughter Jeannette Pasco.

Jeannette graduated from R J Murray High School in St Augustine Florida in 1957 with honors and a full scholarship for teaching, however she decided to take the state board test for nursing & passed it with a 95 average and attend Batty state hospital nursing program in Rome Georgia. Jeannette completed her studies & then moved to New York in 1959 and began working for Mount Sinai Hospital in Manhattan. She also worked for several other organizations; Robert Eastman advertising agency Rockefeller Center Plaza in Manhattan NY, and JP Morgan Chase Long Island headquarters where she later retired in 1995.

Jeanette was a dedicated child of God who loved to serve the Lord. Religion was a way of life for her and was instilled in her at an early age. She continued her fellowship when she moved to South Ozone Park Queens New York where she joined Allen cathedral church in Jamaica New York in 1973. Jeannette then moved to Westbury New York and joined AME Zion church in Westbury 1980, and the Gospel Blessing Center Roosevelt New York where she gained notoriety working with prison ministries in 1985, later she became a member St John's Baptist church joining the usher board where she loved to study the word. Jeannette taught her children the same values in how to be a servant for the Lord.
