### Reflection of Life

She peacefully transitioned on Saturday, October 2, 2021 surrounded by family, doctors, and nurses. She was 54 years young. She had a few nicknames; Vonnie or Joy Joy as she was affectionately called by her Mother and family and Jae, as she was affectionately called by April, and her friends.

Joy was raised in Newark, NJ and attended Cleveland Elementary School. She went to the same elementary school her mother and aunt attended when they were young. She was also accepted at the prestigious Science High School in Newark, NJ. When the family moved to Irvington, NJ. Joy attended and graduated from Irvington High School, June 1985. She also played basketball at Irvington High.

During the summer, she would spend time with family in Deerfield Beach Fl., Ocean City or Camden, NJ. They were always on the go. Joy was a lover of "house" music, an ode to her Mother. She would attend the "House Music" festival every summer especially when she returned home to NJ. Everyone who knows Joy know that she lived and breathed football!!! We can certainly say she was a little obsessed. She was a loyal Pittsburgh Steelers fan and you didn't want to interrupt her when she was watching the game on Sunday afternoon or during Monday and Thursday night football!!! She also loved watching crime shows. She was interested in how the cases were solved.

Joy was a kind, affectionate and sensitive soul. She was also willing to help anyone in need. She would say that her grandmother, Bernice Hill, instilled that attribute in her. She volunteered because of her grandmother, Bernice who taught all her children and grandchildren that we should always do something for others. Sometimes, it did not always work out as she thought. One day, she tried to help two elderly women raise their car window because it was stuck. Unfortunately, she got the window up, but it also shattered in the process!!! She called her Mother and said, "all I was trying to do was to help someone," but she paid the ladies for the window. They both laughed!! She had a heart of gold and would help anyone in need. She was a social butterfly and had many life-long friends. Joy also had a great sense of humor.

She met the love of her life, April Manley, in 2010 through Malika, a mutual friend. Malika set up the blind date. They went out to dinner and the rest is history!!! April thought Joy was a homebody like herself but found out differently. Joy was not a homebody, but it made no difference to April!!! Joy and April entered a Civil Union Partnership in 2012. They remained married for 12 years until her untimely death.
