Obituary

Everett Holmes, 98 of Newark, NJ passed away on Tuesday October 12, 2021 at Mountainside Hospital in Montclair, NJ.

Everett was born on August 23, 1923, in Newark to Madeline Jennings and Chester Holmes. Everett came from a large family. Preceding his death were his Parents and his sisters Madeline Dibugno, Carol Holmes and brothers Chester Holmes, Johnny Holmes, and Joseph Holmes. He leaves to mourn his death his sister Lorraine Neal and brother Charles Holmes.

Everett led a rich life. Graduating from Essex County Technical and Vocational School he became a Mechanic; a profession he loved. He also traveled the world with the Army, and is a WWII Veteran. Everett went on to work for Jaynes Motor Freight for many years, never missing one day of work. Interestingly his son Everett Jr. also went to Essex County Technical and Vocational School and became a Mechanic he loved driving large trucks. Everett was his first born child and passed on Oct. 14, 2012.

He leaves to mourn his passing his two daughters Deborah Martin, and Joan Najeelah, and a son Steven Holmes. Everett was formerly married to Viola Holmes and they were blessed with three children. Everett was later married to Joyce Holmes and they enjoyed a loving marriage until her passing on August 11, 1997, they were blessed with a daughter Joan Najeelah.

Affectionately called Poppie and Uncle, he dedicated his life to loving others as Jesus Christ commanded. As a young man he was known to ride through the neighborhood, giving all the little ones a dollar. Poppie was known for being a very generous and loving man. He kissed on the forehead, supported and encouraged all of his children and grandchildren and anyone, even if he just met you once. This was the most profound quality about Poppie...if you met him...he would touch your heart deeply.

The people who supported Poppie in the last years...doctors, nurses and caretakers all went away feeling blessed, delighted, encouraged and loved. Poppie was also known for generously taking needed things to Women's Shelters...televisions, refrigerators, food etc. whatever he could give. Always thinking of others he was famous for delivering fresh vegetables and groceries to all the family and homeless shelters.

Everett's life was devoted to helping others, never really wanting much for himself. Remarkably one would never hear Poppie complaining...he leaned on the Lord with any pain or misfortune. He strongly believed in honesty, humility, integrity, courage, brotherly love and being in service to others. He often said "I have everything...God gave me everything...I don't need anything." He was truly rich.

Poppie loved Soulful Jazz, Cadillacs, Spaghetti, Mashed potatoes and Cheesecake. He loved his favorite cozy bathrobe from his son Steven, and many special meals lovingly prepared by his niece Saidah. However his most favorite thing was loving people and helping them to feel loved inside.

He studied the Bible daily and loved going to Church. Poppie attended the First Baptist of Hillside for 40 years and was honored for his 40 years of attendance. Poppie also enjoyed his church around the corner, Roseville Presbyterian Church. Poppie never appeared lonely, as he was always reaching out to help others and delighted in the fellowship of his many friends at Church. He studied the Bible several times a week with friends. Peaceful, balanced, happy and content come to mind when you encounter him.

His last few months were spent with his daughter Debbie watching old movies, and spiritual programs...and with his daughter Joan watching PBS and TNT. His bible study friends were close by with prayers and love. He spoke with his God-Child Rahjon daily and had special times with his Grandson Waladeen. Loving prayers with son Stevie, Poppie always reminding us to say our prayers and read our bibles.

Upon his passing at 98 years old Everett was still mentally sharp. He knew he was going home to be with his Lord and held that gracefully and enjoyed the beauty of everyday life till the end.

Poppie was wise, generous, and loving. His signature love sign was a peace sign or a thumbs up....Poppie was always looking for the good and for everyone to be at peace with each other. His favorite philosophy was to love the Lord with all your heart and whenever the family would come and go he would say "I love you Mucho" "With all My Heart" "Adios".

Adios Poppie "We love you with ALL our hearts"
